



BRUNO CASONI



Maestro of the Choir of the Teatro alla Scala and the "G. Verdi" Conservatory in Milan, Milan-born Bruno Casoni, after earning diplomas in piano, composition, choral music and choral conducting at the "Giuseppe Verdi" Conservatory in his hometown, was director of the Choir of the "Pierluigi da Palestrina" Theater in Cagliari, Italy, and later, from 1983, became another Choirmaster at the Teatro alla Scala in Milan, a post he held until 1994. Also in 1994 he became director of the Children's Voice Choir of the Teatro alla Scala.

Since 1979 he has been teaching choral exercises at the Milan Conservatory of Music. In 1984 he founded the Milan Pomeriggi Musicali Choir, which he directed until 1992. At the same time, he has collaborated with numerous Italian and foreign music institutions and festivals both as choir director and conducting various orchestral ensembles. He has toured to various continents and recorded several records. In 1994 he was appointed director of the Choir of the Teatro Regio in Turin, at the helm of which he has achieved unanimous acclaim in the operatic repertoire, while also carrying out intense work to expand its concert repertoire and intensify collaborations with other musical institutions. Particularly significant is the one established with the RAI National Symphony Orchestra.

In 2002 he was appointed Director of the Chorus of the Teatro alla Scala.
